

## Bios for LA Faculty (Feb 8, 2025):



**Keynote: Steve Denino – Interim CEO, Barbershop Harmony Society** – Steve has been on the Society Board six years, the last three as executive vice president; he also has served as chair of its strategic planning committee. He was a founding member of the BHS Leadership Operations Team, which was created to support local chapters as they grow in membership, talent and community impact. “Our future rests in the collective efforts of the Board, staff, district and chapter volunteers and our partners at HFI,” Denino said. “Barbershop is for all of us, regardless of factors such as ethnicity, identity or whether you want to sing for fun and community service or are driven to compete” At the end of the day, barbershop changes lives. We must create options and opportunities to sing.”



**Jeff Osborne, President Carolina's District** has been a barbershopper most of his life. His quartet - Midnight Express - won the Dixie District championship and sang on the International stage 3x placing as high as 22nd. He's served on faculty as a performance coach at 15 district schools in Dixie, Sunshine, Mid Atlantic, and Carolinas and has coached 7 district champ quartets, 3 top 20 quartets, and 4 international chorus contestants. On the chapter level he held offices of VP of Marketing, VP of Music, and President. Jeff is our current Carolinas District Barbershopper of the Year and will serve as District President 2025-26.



**Dave Mills, President – Sunshine District** - joined BHS in 1991, and through the years, has performed and competed with numerous quartets as well as musical director for several choruses. He was first certified as a BHS judge in the Singing category in 1993 – was later appointed as Singing Category Specialist in 2013 – then went on to serve as the Society Contest & Judging Committee (SCJC) Chair from 2016-2019. In addition to his continued role as Past Chair, he now serves the Sunshine District as their district President. David and his lovely wife, Linda (married since 1974) make their home in Tampa, Florida.



**President's Track - Jack Klotzbach (Sunshine District)-** Jack is 19-year barbershopper with experience at the chapter level: President (4 years), Chapter Development VP (1 year), Music Performance VP (2 years), Marketing VP (1 year), Secretary (1 year), Youth in Harmony (1 year), and Show Production (19 years). He has 5 years of experience as the District VP of Education providing training in all chapter positions except Treasurer and Secretary. He is also a two-time chapter Barbershopper of the Year.

Jack has been a member of five different chapters and dabbles in arranging and tag writing.



**Secretary Track - Richard Harris (NSC)** became a member of BHS in 1991 in Hagerstown, MD. He has been a member of seven different chapter serving in all chapter positions except Music VP. He became a Charter member of the Mt Pleasant, SC Chapter in 2012 and became the Treasurer 2012 and Secretary - Treasurer in 2014. Chapter leadership jokes that I am those for life. He will be joining the Winston-Salem, NC Chapter to

compete with them in the Senior Chorus competition in San Antonio in Jan 25. He became a member of the Carolinas Barbershop Harmony District Board of Directors in 2016 and District Secretary in June 2016 until 2024. He is currently a Board Member At-Large and will be District Secretary in 2025. Richard has taught the Secretary's and Treasurer's tracks in Leadership Academy.

**Treasurer Track - Tom Martyn (NSC),** aka Designated Curmudgeon, has been singing with the Wilmington, NC chapter since 1997. Tom has served as the NSC District Treasurer and is currently Treasurer of the Wilmington Chapter. He has led the Treasurer's track at several Leadership Academies in the past. In addition to his Treasury experience, Tom has been a Chapter President, Membership VP, Music VP, District EVP and District President. Tom is also a member of the District Hall of Fame.



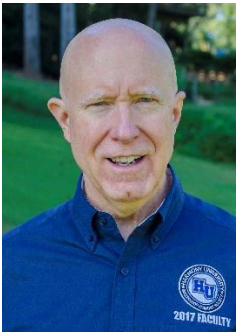
**Membership Track - Jeff Osborne (NSC)** has been a barbershopper most of his life. **Director's Track - Dr. Don Campbell (NSC)** is Professor Emeritus of Music at Southern Wesleyan University in Central, South Carolina. Prior to his appointment at SWU in 1998, he taught vocal music for 20 years at Redwood High School in Visalia, California. Dr. Campbell received his Bachelor of Arts degree in music education from California State University, Fullerton, his Master of Arts degree in choral conducting from California State University, Fresno, and his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Arizona State University. As a choral clinician, Dr. Campbell has traveled to seventeen states and Canada, Scotland, the Netherlands, New Zealand, Germany, and Australia to conduct choirs and festival choruses and present choral clinics. Active in barbershopping, Dr. Campbell has directed Upstate Carolina's Palmetto Statesmen Chorus, Visalia California's Mighty Oak Chorus and Hanford, California's Kingsmen Chorus, taking the latter to first place in competition. He has been on the Directors College faculty at the Barbershop Harmony Society's Harmony University since 1999. He is currently the conductor for the Chorale of the Greater Anderson Musical Arts Consortium (a civic chorale of 70 singers with professional orchestra).”





**Music and Performance Track – Tom Parker (NSC)** - Tom Parker is the VP for Music and Performance for the NSC District. A former Music Judge, Tom has served on the Music Theory/Arranging Faculty at Harmony and Directors' College and is the current Music VP for the NC Harmony Brigade. Bass of 2001 Dixie District Quartet Champion 'Crescendo' and of 2022 International Senior Quartet Bronze Medalist 'Aspire', Tom currently sings bass with 2024 NSC Senior Quartet Champion 'Retreads'.

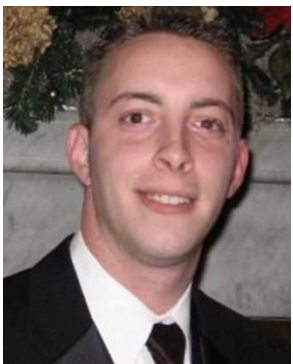

given over \$500,000 to local charities over its history and boasts a show program which topped 130 pages this year. The Pinehurst Chapter averages about \$25,000 per year to local charities mostly raised from ad sales and ticket sales for its annual show.
