The Judging System

Contestants are evaluated by three judging categories. Each judge evaluates the overall performance from the perspective of his respective category, as summarized below. However, there is a common ground shared by all categories that the judges use to evaluate the singing and performance skills. The total score should consistently reflect the overall presentation.

Musicality

The Musicality judge is responsible for adjudicating the musical elements of the performance. He judges the degree to which the musical delivery demonstrates an artistic sensitivity to the song's ongoing predominant musical element(s) and mood or story, as well as the extent to which the musical performance displays the hallmarks of the barbershop style. One of the primary hallmarks of barbershop music is its consonant harmony. Thus, the quality of performance depends largely on the ensemble presence, accurate execution, and artistic delivery of the consonant harmonies traditionally identified with the barbershop style.

Performance

These judges evaluate how effectively a performer brings the song to life. They judge the entertainment value of the performance; the art of the performance. One significant goal of any art form is communication. A barbershop performance refers to how the artist communicates his message and vision via the transformation of a song into an entertaining experience for an audience. The performers' goal is to create a high level of entertainment through the performance. The means to that end are as varied as the personality, abilities and creative skills of the performers.

Singing

Judges in this category evaluate the degree to which the performer achieves artistic singing in the barbershop style: the production of vibrant, rich, resonant, technically accurate, and highly skilled sound, created both by the individual singer's use of good vocal techniques, and by the ensemble processes of tuning, balancing, unity of sound and precision. They listen for a sense of precise intonation, a feeling of fullness or expansion of sound, a perception of a high degree of vocal skill, a high level of unity and consistency throughout the performance, and a freedom from apparent effort that allows the full communication of the lyric and song.





COACHING AVAILABLE !!

District Music Leadership is now offering an opportunity for coaching to all quartets and choruses in the Carolinas District. The coaching can take place during your regular rehearsal time or perhaps as part of a special retreat. You decide what to focus on, from Musicality to Singing to Performance – or all of the above. Coaching will be provided by approved members of the Carolinas District Coaching Guild. These coaches are some of the top quartet performers, chorus directors, judges - all among the very best musical talent in the Carolinas District.

You simply pay a modest flat fee (far less than would typically be the case for private coaching) to the District, and the District then funds the coaching fee + travel expenses for the coach. This arrangement covers coaching for a quartet or chorus; any additional coaching arrangement would be handled directly between the performers and the coach. Finally, the Chapter would be responsible for any required overnight housing.

We hope that many of you will take advantage of this excellent opportunity! We all want to get better, and the Carolinas District Coaching Guild is here to help. For more details, or to initiate a coaching session, please contact me at the email below. Cheers!

Why not try some Woodshedding?

How often have you heard the expression, "Let's get back to our roots", when referring to focusing on the basics? Well, in Barbershop, it means lots of fun, improving your ear singing, having fun discovering new chords, making new friends, learning new skills, and did I mention, Lots of Fun! Come by the woodshedding room at the convention and sing a few chestnuts with us, learn how to create and discover new arrangements of songs you never knew, but quickly grow to love because you are part of the discovery process. Using just a melody line and 3 other singers, let your ear tell you where to go and find where your part takes you. And remember, if someone else is singing the note you want to sing... just tell them, "Get off my note!" No experience necessary. Did you know that written arrangements were not allowed in Barbershop Competitions until the late 1950s? Ear singing is how it all began.

Now that you know the basics, here is a challenge for any group of 4 people that want to take on the task: Help us preserve and practice the almost lost art of woodshedding. Come by the Woodshed Room and request a melody line. Go off on your own and sing it until you think you have an arrangement that works. Come back and sing it for a Certified Woodshed Adjudicator (That would be me!). If approved you will be given permission to take your song around to the hospitality suites on Saturday night to sing in front of your peers. You can be proud of your accomplishment and be sure to tell them that you are your own arranger for this song!


